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About the Guide

The Psychiatric Survivor Archives, Toronto, is proud to provide this updated Guide to its collection. The Guide is a listing of all surveyed materials in the archive. As the Guide keeps growing, we invite researchers using the Guide to report any error or omission. In the meantime, PSAT volunteers continue to add to the Guide in an effort to provide the public with as much information about our collection as possible.

The Archive collection is divided into fonds (sub-collections that each donor has given the archive). Each fonds is divided into boxes of folders, or objects that are catalogued separately. Each folder contains any number of files/items. Some items may be copies, and sometimes the same item may be found in other folders and boxes, or even fonds, as they have been organized by each donor according to their own needs. The Archive seeks to preserve the order of materials donated, and preserve them in a way that can be accessed. As materials are put into folders, a description about their contents and origins is made and each folder is given a code. Look for the following:

- A numeric code indicating where in the collection the item can be found, and the accessibility status of the item,
- After a slash in the code, a simple description of materials found in the folder including type of material and origin by place and date, as well as any overall subject discussed in the contents,
- A rounder description of folder contents is found under the code, including:
 - What it is: Titles or other descriptions of what is in the folder,
 - Who made it: Author/s or creator/s of the contents, including organizations,
 - When it was made: In parentheses, the beginning and end dates of production of contents,
 - Where it was made: Provenance (i.e., origin) of contents, and additional bibliographic information (e.g., publisher, editor, translator, etc).

The process of surveying an archive is painstaking and slow, and improvements can be made to the survey as time permits. The Guide was started on October 25, 2012, by several PSAT archivists, board members, and volunteers. Archivists should consult PSAT policies and procedures to continue and improve upon past practices in surveying the collection.

About PSAT

The Psychiatric Survivor Archives, Toronto, is a non-profit corporation run by a Board of elected psychiatric survivors. The PSAT Board establishes its by-laws and policies for the purpose of maintaining the archive. Among its objectives is the appointment of archivists, the scheduling of visits by researchers, and the protection of the materials in the collection.

PSAT's collection has grown over many years, and now includes several fonds from donors around the world. It also includes various donated objects, or to use an archival term, "realia," including:

A library of donated books (donated by various individuals and organizations)
Rug hookings (Empowerment Council, CAMH)
Sculpture (Cyril Greenland, 1919 - 2012)
Other realia items (Queen Street Outreach Society, Allan Markman, PSAT)
Phoenix Rising Magazine (Don Weitz)

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The Guide gives each folder in each box a specific *folder code*. The Table of Contents page allows researchers to survey the entire list of boxes and folders by folder code. Each folder code reveals useful information about the folder’s contents, including locations, dates, and subjects. Soon the Guide will allow researchers to link to any of the boxes listed in the Table of Contents.

An example of a code is:

MF.5.10.1.A/BK,US-East,1990s,Poetry

This code describes how each folder is organized, beginning with the following:

- a) a two-letter code for the name of the fonds (e.g., “MF” for Mindfreedom),
- b) a number for the box in which a folder or other content is found (e.g., “5”),
- c) a number for the folder in that box in which contents are found (e.g., “10”),
- d) a number for how many distinct items are in that folder (e.g., “1”)
- e) a letter indicating whether the material is: available (“A”), damaged (“D”), online (“O”), or private/inaccessible (“P”),

Note the slash divides the organizational details from the provenencial (origin of material) details. After a slash in the folder code, you may find more information about the contents of the folder, and their provenance (i.e., origins), in the following order:

- f) a two-letter code for the type of materials, such as newsletters, letters, poems, or posters (e.g., BK for books; all codes are listed below),
- g) the country (and possibly national region) from which the material came (e.g., US-East for Eastern United States),
- h) the period or decade in which the material was produced (e.g., 1990s),
- i) the subject of most of the folder’s contents (e.g., “Poetry” or “Empowerment”— search a list of subjects below).

When you know what you would like to obtain from the archive, copy the folder code, contact PSAT, and ask for an appointment to access that folder. Archivists will then schedule a time for someone to procure the folder/s you requested, and will accompany you on your research. About the Collective Fonds

The Collective Fonds is produced for and by the broader community of psychiatric patients/clients, ex-patients/clients, users/consumers, and survivors, prisoners, and detainees who have donated flyers, posters, poetry, writings, audio-visual media, realia, etc.

The Collective Fonds was started by former PSAT board member, Kevin Jackson, and has been highlighted here to encourage people to donate materials. Their contributions connect PSAT to many 'mad' communities and augment the older, larger accessions sent by more 'established' activists and organizations.

Each accession here includes a bolded name to identify the donor (anonymous donors will be listed in numeric order of contributions). This allows us to keep each donor's materials together, and add to the materials over time, just like in the rest of the PSAT collection.

Worldwide web hyperlinks and electronic files have been sent to us over time. We include them in the Collective Fonds and list them after the physical materials. If you encounter a bad link, please let us know so that we can correct or disconnect it.

MindFreedom Fonds

About the MindFreedom Fonds

MindFreedom International (MFI), formerly known as Support Coalition International, is one of the first organized international human rights and advocacy organizations led by psychiatric survivors. MFI is made up of over 100 organizations, with its head offices in Eugene, Oregon, U.S.A. Its website is www.mindfreedom.org and its main publication is presently called *Mindfreedom Journal*.

MFI founder David Oaks spoke with PSAT founder Geoffrey Reaume during the 1990s and archivist Mel Starkman in 2001 just as PSAT was getting started. Since there was no space to house the archives, David waited until the summer and fall of 2006 to donate many of MFI's files, publications, letters and memorabilia. Other accessions were donated in the winter of 2007 and in 2008. The Mindfreedom fonds provides a rich resource on psychiatric survivor history and activism in the US and the world.
